For a year before the Russian Federation's full-scale invasion of Ukraine, it had prepared to impose a parallel European energy crisis. Moscow undermined the filling of EU winter gas storage and later massively cut pipeline flows. Europe was plunged into a severe energy crisis.

Although Germany and the EU have survived ensuing winters, the energy crisis persists as high prices and supply concerns, inflicting continued damage on EU firms and citizens' livelihoods.

In retaliation, EU and transatlantic allies imposed severe energy and other sanctions, including an oil-price cap, to undermine Moscow's war-making capacities.

Who, if anyone, is winning the ongoing Energy War? Are EU-USA-G7 sanctions effective? Is the energy crisis sparking German and EU "deindustrialization" and recession? Have high-priced, maximalist "100% renewables" rendered Germany vulnerable? What could the EU-G7 do to accomplish undercutting Russian capacity, ending the energy crisis, and sustaining Ukraine to win?
